Rubina's son, Tariq, suffered burns from playing in the rubbish. Her elder son, Javed, who's disabled, has serious respiratory problems.

At least a third of the world's waste is subject to open dumping or burning. Open burning releases smoke and toxins estimated to cause 270,000 deaths globally each year (Word Bank; Tearfund)

When you twin, you will be sent a certificate to put on your kitchen, waste or wheelie bin – showing a photo of the rubbish collection and recycling enterprise that you have twinned with overseas.
